a very short history of Krakow

Situated on the Vistula river Krakow dates back to the 7th century. The city has traditionally been a leading center of Polish academic, cultural and artistic life, and currently is also one of Poland's most important economic centers. Here was the capital of Poland from 1038 to 1596.

- 11 state universities
- 21 private-founded high schools
- 203 000 students (32% of Polish students)

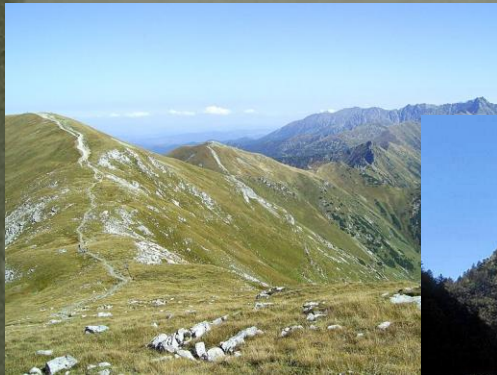
